Afternoon, I guess we're getting close to evening, so. My name is Ralph Kelsey. I'm the -- I'm chair of the Tioga County IDA.

And the agency is conducting this hearing pursuant to general municipal law 859-a and we're here to seek public comment on the application for financial assistance and associated state environmental quality review issues. And so as a result of that we're here assessing that assessment submitted by Tioga Downs Racetrack.

The acceptance of the filing by the agency does not infer any position on the approval or the disapproval of the financial assistance requested. No position will be taken by the agency until all the public hearings and comments are concluded. And a copy of the cost benefit analysis provided by the Department of Economic Development and Planning is available here. Just see LeeAnn. It's available here in the front of the room for review.

The notice of this hearing was published on October 10th, 2015 in the Press & Sun Bulletin. Each person wishing to speak shall state his or her name and if you are speaking on behalf of any organization or entity please identify that organization or entity. Each speaker will be given five minutes and this hearing shall remain open until 6:00 or longer if public comment warrants.

I want to remind you that the purpose of this hearing is to afford you an opportunity to make statements and comments on the application and project, the plan of the IDA. Your comments will be considered by the IDA making its decision. This is not a question and answer session. So please remember to identify yourself and the organization or entity that you are speaking on behalf of prior to your comments.

First, I'd like to ask and introduce
LeeAnn Tinney and ask her as director of
Economic Development and Planning to

explain the tax benefits requested by Tioga downs

MS. TINNEY: Hello. I'm LeeAnn
Tinney, director of Economic Development
and Planning for Tioga County. This
project is associated with the Tioga Downs
Racetrack request for assistance with the
construction and equipping of the proposed
expansion to the existing facility located
at 2384 West River Road, Town of Nichols.

Tioga Downs Racetrack has been recommended by the gaming siting board to the gaming commission for the fourth license to be issue in New York State.

The request for application made by Tioga Downs Racetrack calls for a \$191,219 square foot expansion to include a 161 room hotel, amenities building, casino floor expansion, restaurant and outdoor concert venue. The projected investment for the construction and equipment is anticipated to be \$134,825,000. Construction is planned to begin in October of this year.

The project will create an

anticipated direct new workforce in Tioga
County of 150 employees in the first two
years of operation with an associated
annual payroll of over \$6,250,000. The
impact of the annual payroll over the term
of a PILOT equals \$476 million in earnings.
This includes anticipated new and retained
direct and indirect earnings. In addition,
there will be 550 construction jobs, 319
indirect jobs associated with the expansion
build out.

The Department of Economic

Development and Planning staff took a very close look at the nature of this project and the opportunity that has been presented to the Town of Nichols and Tioga County.

Several important factors to consider include between the direct new jobs, indirect new jobs, retained existing jobs and retained indirect jobs, the overall impact to jobs in the Southern Tier will exceed 1,000. The project will bring a \$134 million investment to Tioga County.

The project will add to the real property

1 The company will bring increased tax base. 2 gaming revenue to the county and town. The expansion will bring increased hotel, motel 3 4 tax revenue to Tioga County. The expansion 5 will open new opportunities to develop the 6 tourism industry in Tioga County. 7 company has an extremely strong track 8 record of community support and the Tioga 9 County Legislature and the Tioga Central 10 School Board have indicated their support 11 of the project and this request. 12 Therefore, based on these facts, it is the 13 Department of Economic Development and 14 Planning's recommendation to the IDA board 15 is to allow the sales tax exemption, 16 mortgage recording tax exemption and the 17 real property tax abatement for the Tioga Downs Racetrack project. 18 19 MR. KELSEY: Thank you, LeeAnn. 20 based on her comments and what has been 21 read would Rebecca come forward. 22 Hi. My name is MS. MAFFEI: Yes. Rebecca Maffei and I'm the director of 23 24 Tioga County Tourism. I want to thank you

for this opportunity to voice the support of my office and my personal support as a long-time Tioga County resident for approval of Tioga Downs's application for financial assistance.

The expansion of Tioga Downs is a tremendous opportunity to increase outside visitation to Tioga County. As many of you — as you may know New York State has been investing in the tourism economy more aggressively over the past several — several years and in 2014 saw over 100 billion in economic impact throughout the state. Unfortunately due to past flooding, having smaller attractions and limited resources, Tioga County was not able to take advantage of major economic tourism drivers such as group travel and targeted tourism marketing.

The Tioga Downs expansion will be a beacon for new visitors to Tioga County and therefore new revenue for its -- for its residents. To maximum the potential for spending throughout the county our office

1 and Tioga Downs are investing our time and 2 resources to look for opportunities to 3 spread the wealth and bring customers to 4 businesses in Tioga County. Many of these businesses as well as municipalities recognize the potential for a lucrative 7 return in the future and are also investing 8 resources. And I encourage the Tioga County IDA to also invest in the project 10 alongside various other agencies and 11 entrepreneurs in Tioga County by granting 12 their application for financial assistance. 13 Thank you. 14 Thank you. At this time MR. KELSEY:

next on the list is Gwen, Tioga County Chamber of Commerce.

MS. KANIA: I'm Gwen Kania, president of the Tioga County Chamber of Commerce. I'm here say that we believe the financial assistance for Tioga Downs Racetrack should be accepted. Mr. Gural and Tioga Downs has proven time and time again that they are committed to this county.

Tioga Downs is not a fly-by-night

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1 operation and they're tireless work to 2 receive the location approval is an indication of that. The license and 3 4 expansion is almost given at this point, so 5 how sad would it be if this county has --6 which has the most to gain from having a 7 casino is not able to give some concessions to one of its greatest benefactors. 8 The incomes from the jobs retained 9 10 and created revenues from the gaming and 11 the revenues from the additional tourism 12 would more than offset any of the costs 13 incurred by the county. 14 I believe that the givers gain and 15 this time the IDA should be the giver. 16 MR. KELSEY: Thank you. Dr. Baust? 17 DR. BAUST: Can I sit? 18 MR. KELSEY: If you can talk loud, 19 you -- you may sit and remain there. 20 DR. BAUST: I will try. I didn't 21 come with a prepared statement, but I'd 22 like to speak in support of -- of the 23 request for a PILOT program. This county 24 and much of the Southern Tier has been

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suffering a decline in jobs, revenue and so forth actually since the early '80s when IBM began their relocation process and we've had a number of setbacks with the recession, with the flood and so forth. And I -- I think this is a good step and other steps like it are good because they will help, again, improve the employment opportunities, they will make the county more attractive. I think it will stimulate other parts of the county also to think creatively on how to develop some economic activities. So while there's -- there's, you know, a perception long-term revenue shortfall with respect to taxes, that's really not real in a sense. I mean, there will be increased taxes paid by this and the other organizations and I think it'll work for the betterment to the community, so --

MR. KELSEY: Thank you. Thank you very much. At this point seeing that we do have time is there anyone else that would like to make a comment about the project?

Well, if not we will -- I guess we adjourn this until 6:00 to see if anyone else might arrive that has comments regarding this --this project so we'll go into adjournment. Feel free to stick around. First, I would like to have LeeAnn
Tinney director of the Economic Planning
and Development explain the tax benefits

requested by Crown Cork & Seal USA Inc, again a subsidiary of Crown Holdings Inc.

MS. TINNEY: LeeAnn Tinney, director of Economic Development and Planning for Tioga County. This project is associated with the Crown Cork & Seal USA request for assistance. Crown Cork & Seal USA manufactures packaging products for consumer goods. The primary products include steel and aluminum cans for beverage, household and other consumer products and metal vacuum closures and caps.

The projected investment for the construction and equipment is anticipated to be \$132,800,000. Construction is planned to begin in November of this year and to be completed by January of 2017. The request for assistance for the -- is for the purchase of real property, construction and equipping of the facility.

The Crown Cork & Seal USA subject property location is Berry Road, Town of Nichols. This is an IDA owned 40 plus acre

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site. The project calls for the development of a 525,000 square foot facility to house a manufacturing area of 375,000 square feet and warehousing, office space for 150,000 square feet. important to note that this property is presently owned by the IDA. There are no real property taxes collected on the site now nor for the previous 15 years.

The project will create an anticipated new workforce in Tioga County of 164 employees in the first two years of operation with an associated annual payroll of over \$7.6 million. The impact of the annual payroll over the term of the PILOT equals \$488 million in earnings. additional 111 jobs are accepted as an indirect result of the project, and there will be 550 construction jobs and 319 indirect jobs associated -- associated with the building of the facility.

The Department of Economic Development and Planning staff took a very close look at the nature of this project

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and the opportunity that has been presented to the Town of Nichols and Tioga County. Several important factors to consider include the company is a long-standing Fortune 500 company. The company plans to offer above-average manufacturing pay rates for this area. The company offers an excellent benefit package to their employees. The project will bring a \$133 million investment to Tioga County. project will add to the real property tax The project will bring direct and base. indirect jobs to the Southern Tier. company has a strong record of community support in other areas where they are The Tioga Legislature and the located. Owego Apalachin School Board have indicated their support of the project and this Therefore, based on these facts request. it is the Department of Economic Development and Planning's recommendation to the IDA board to allow the sales tax and real property tax abatement with the Crown Cork & Seal USA project.

MR. KELSEY: Thank you, LeeAnn. And again if we could have the folks come forward or turn to the crowd again. Gwen, if you'd like to --

MS. KANIA: Sure.

MR. KELSEY: -- comment.

MS. KANIA: I'm Gwen Kania, president of the Tioga County Chamber of Commerce.

I've been the president of the chamber for over two years now and one of the things that I've noticed when people like to bend my ear is about what's wrong with the county and their ways to try and help solve the problem. And one of the most common complaints that I hear from people is about the lack of jobs that pay decent wages, the lack of manufacturing in the area.

The Southern Tier used to be a Mecca for the manufacturing industry but that's faded over the decades and it's hardly the valley of opportunity any longer. You see more negative headlines in the paper than positive. Economic Development and Planning works hard to bring viable

projects to the county, but they face many road blocks along the way. One of the biggest road blocks is usually the fact that Pennsylvania is right just a couple miles away. We don't want this project to go elsewhere, this project deserves the consideration and the concessions to make it happen.

Why do I think this should happen? But my question to you is have you Googled this company? The company is over 100 years old. It's the number one producer of food cans and metal vacuum closures in the world. Number one or two producer of aerosol cans in the markets that they compete in. Number 3 producer of beverage They employee over 23,000 people cans. worldwide, have 149 facilities in 40 countries and in 2014 they had a net sales of \$2.9 billion, and that's a B not an M. A company with a global presence of Crown Cork & Seal wants to build in Tioga County, well I say, why, let's go with for it. not.

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You know, we have plenty to offer. The incentive offers a lot, but any location competitor also knows how to do and plan and the global companies usually don't make poor decisions when presented with numbers and facts and figures so we have to make it attractive.

I've looked over the cost benefit analysis that LeeAnn has presented of the financial application -- or assistance application as I'm sure you have, but where else can you get 164 full-time higher paying jobs that would add merely \$8 million wages -- in wages to this area especially in a short-time span by 2018. The construction phase would bring 550 jobs and these are only the direct jobs. nothing to say about the indirect jobs or incomes that would result from Cork -- or Crown Cork & Seal starting in Tioga County. This area has been crying for manufacturing for years. This business even with the sales tax savings and PILOT that they would receive over 30 years would be adding to

1 our economy and tax base with the jobs and 2 hopes people will buy homes and settle in and raise families and live a quality life 3 4 in this region, which is what we need. 5 we can't let this one get away. 6 MR. KELSEY: Thank you. Sarah 7 Campbell, Hinman, Howard & Kattell. MS. CAMPBELL: 8 Hi. My name is Sarah 9 Campbell, I'm an attorney with Hinman, 10 Howard & Kattell. We're acting as local 11 counsel for the applicant, I also have with 12 me, I'll just do the Vanna White pointing 13 here to Tom Johnson, he is the 14 representative from Crown Cork & Seal. 15 We're just here to answer any questions 16 that you might have. I'll provide you any 17 additional -- additional information that 18 you might need. Thank you for the meeting 19 tonight. 20 MR. KELSEY: So you will be around 21 after -- after --22 MR. CAMPBELL: We're sticking around. MR. KELSEY: -- after this is done. 23 24 Ken Snowden.

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I'm not sure I fully MR. SNOWDEN: understand all the parameters, but I really question a 30 year PILOT. I've been in and out of local government for the past 30 years, usually a 10 year PILOT is the average. The other question is I think if you look at the national laws, and I'm not speaking about this company in particular, but the national law is that most companies do not come close to coming up with the actual numbers that the PILOT projects. 30 years encompasses almost 8 presidential elections and I'm not sure that that long term for a company that can afford to build without a mortgage should be something that's considered.

The application fee for the Perm 33 was waived by NYS DOT; Perm 50 does have an inspection and/or supervision fee of \$370 per day, for an anticipated fee of \$1480 (4 days) to be reimbursed to DOT for inspection/supervision of the construction of the road. Ms. Tinney will discuss this expense with Home Leasing since they are the responsible party constructing the road.
