

Tioga Smiles NEW Dental Unit



2019 was a big year for the Dental Program! After several funding requests, floor plan re-designs and much anticipation, the new "Tioga Smiles" mobile dental unit hit the streets of Tioga County.

The new dental unit was made possible from a Community Development Block Grant and funds from the Appalachian Regional Commission and Floyd Hooker Foundation. The unit itself was built not far from Tioga County, in Oneonta, NY at Medical Coaches.

The new mobile unit is different from the previous dental trailer in that it is 13 feet smaller. This allows for greater mobility and more options for best sites. There are 2 dental chairs, a waiting area, and office space. The interior resembles an ocean, including a beach scene and under-the-water wall wrap complete with a shark and diver.

Community Health Assessment

Tioga County, NY 2019-2024 Community Health Assessment



Tioga County, NY 2019-2021 Community Health Improvement Plan 2019 marked an important year with the completion of the Community Health Assessment (CHA) and Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP). Community partners identified health behaviors; how they relate to poor or good health outcomes. Interviews with key community members gave a voice to the data.

"Locally and state-wide, overweight and obesity are increasingly significant causes of excess morbidity and mortality. An astonishing 61% of NYS adults are overweight or obese and the incidence of childhood obesity has tripled in the past 30 years. This phenomenon is driven by unhealthy patterns of food intake and inadequate exercise.

The current medical system is poorly positioned to address this issue as it remains focused on the adverse outcomes associated with obesity such as hypertension, type II diabetes and cardiovascular disease rather than upon the lifestyle and dietary changes that are required. This multifactorial health problem remains a significant challenge and its solution will require significant changes in our food selections, activity patterns and expectations about what can and cannot be achieved through traditional medical interventions."

Tioga County Rabies Prevention

2019 proved to be another busy year for our rabies program. A total of nine animals test positive for rabies, including: one deer, four foxes, three raccoons, and a bat! Remember, if an animal is acting strange, it may be sick. Stay away and call someone from our team right away!

Richford Water Testing

In September, Richford Town Planning Board, in partnership with Tioga County Public Health and New York State Department of Health, announced a Drinking Water survey for the Richard Hamlet. Site evaluations and water samples were analyzed from 10-15 households in the hamlet. Participation was voluntary, with no cost to residents. Data collected will be used to assist the Richford Planning Board, and the Hamlet, with future planning and ideas for addressing water supply safety.



New York State Law Changes

2019 saw changes that effected many of our residents. In June, New York State Legislature voted to repeal religious exemptions from school vaccinations. This led to our nursing team working hard to help students catch up on their vaccinations prior to the start of the school year. There were endless phone calls with parents, school officials, and provider's offices, all working to keep students in school and ensure that each of the school districts were in compliance.

On October 1, 2019, New York State Department of Health changed the definition of elevated blood lead levels to 5 micrograms per deciliter. By lowering this level, more children will be identified as being lead poisoned. Goal is to target education and outreach for families, which should help limit the impact of lead poisoning on a child.



What Do You Mean

2019 Pertussis Outbreak in Tioga County

2019 began with our team tackling a localized pertussis (whooping cough) outbreak, mainly effecting students. From January through late March, 25 total cases were documented. Our nursing team conducted numerous case contact investigations and collaborated with local doctor's offices to ensure proper treatment of cases and contacts. We worked closely with school nurses and administrators to identify and contain possible cases.

Every year the Tioga County Adult Immunization Coalition is tasked with working on an intervention plan. This year, the coalition chose to focus efforts toward increasing the amount of adults that have received their Tdap (booster shot for whooping cough).



Child Find

Child Find screens children, birth through age three, who are suspected or at risk for a developmental delay or disability. A developmental screening tool is sent to the parent/guardian every two months to monitor the child's growth and development. If the child starts falling behind in any one area, the child is referred to our Early Intervention Program for evaluation. This screening tool is also utilized by doctors. Over the past ten years, we have screened hundreds of children through this program. In 2020, we hope to go digital and make it easier for families to complete the screening!



Tioga County Resource Guide



Cancer Prevention in Action Grant

2019 kicked off the first of five years for the Cancer Prevention in Action Grant (CPiA). We teamed up with the Broome County Health Department to bring cancer prevention efforts into our county.

Goals of the CPiA Grant:

- Prevent skin cancer through the promotion of sun safety
- Promote the HPV vaccine to prevent cervical cancer
- Promote cancer screenings through promotion of paid-time off policies for employees

2019 Program Highlights:

- Sun safety education at Abide in the Vine Childcare Center and Family Enrichment Network
- Sun safety policies were signed by Abide in the Vine Childcare Center and Tioga County Public Health
- Received a 13x26 tent, an inflatable tent, two sunscreen dispensers, and a shade structure for local organizations










Child Passenger Safety

Public Health Preparedness



National Guard Training

On November 14th, over 70 Tioga County employees and residents attended the Citizen Preparedness Training. This training was made possible through the partnership of Tioga County Public Health, Tioga County Emergency Management, Tioga Opportunities, Inc., Southern Tier Independence Center, and Tioga Downs.

The Citizen Preparedness Corps gives residents the tools and resources to prepare for any type of disaster, respond accordingly, and recover as quickly as possible to pre-disaster conditions. Trainings are led by the New York National Guard, working with experts from the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services' Office of Emergency Management and Office of Fire Prevention and Control. The training provided an introduction to responding to a natural or man-made disaster. Participants were advised on how to properly prepare for any disaster, including developing a family emergency plan and stocking up on emergency supplies. A key component of this training is distribution of free NYS Disaster Preparedness Kits to all participants containing key items to assist individuals in the immediate aftermath of a disaster. The state training and kits help New Yorkers be the most-trained and best-prepared citizens in the country.



Child Fatality Review Board

The Broome-Tioga Child Fatality Review Board plays a role in preventing child deaths by reviewing preventable deaths involving children 18 and younger.

In 2019, five Tioga County cases were presented with a close examination of if, how, these deaths could have been avoided.

The majority of the infant cases presented were related to unsafe sleep practices. This indicates more education and outreach is needed to ensure babies are sleeping alone, on their backs, in an area with no blankets or toys.
