The steering committee is meeting with the Branding and Design Team to begin this process of defining a new brand for the Village of Owego. The contract with ID SignSystems has been submitted to the state.

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds

Tioga County Tourism received ARPA funds for new tourism initiatives. Planning for a new brand, travel guide and website designs are the 2022 focus for a portion of these funds.

Tioga Arts Council 50th Anniversary Celebration

Becca is on the committee that is assisting in organizing a series of events that will commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the Tioga Arts Council. The Visitor Center will also be dedicating space for exhibitions and promotions for the Anniversary.

Recruitment Website

The branding process and website navigation for the recruitment website is ongoing. The tagline "Find Your Way Here" has been chosen and a logo is in being developed.

Agricultural Resource Group (ARG) / Finger Lakes Farm Country (FLFC)

Tourism will be working with ARG to organize and promote Sundaes at the Farm in July. We will also be coordinating with Cornell Cooperative Extension to update and provide content for the website.

Events

All regular events are being planned for 2022. Lori has been adding events to our calendar. A new event fundraiser, the Tioga Tour Gran Fondo, is in the planning process. It is a biking event that is part of a nation-wide cycling race organization. It will be a timed race for amateur competitors, but will also be able to be enjoyed by those that simply want to ride. Tourism has assisted with providing routes and information from our past event "Bike Tioga" and our Bad Ass Bike Tour brochure to assist with planning. We will also be building out a web page on our website to help promote the event.

Tioga County Tourism has been approved to run a \$30,000 cooperative marketing program in 2022. Outreach for applications will begin shortly.

RESOLUTION NO. – 22 AUTHORIZATION TO USE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS AS MATCH FOR SOUTHERN TIER NETWORK USDA RECONNECT GRANT APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF BROADBAND IN THE TOWN OF NICHOLS

WHEREAS: The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Broadband ReConnect Program furnishes loans and grants to provide funds for the costs of construction, improvement, or acquisition of facilities and equipment needed to provide broadband service in eligible rural areas; and

WHEREAS: Rural areas include cities, villages, townships and towns with no more than 20,000 residents according to the latest US Census Data; and

WHEREAS: The Town of Nichols fits the USDA defined criteria under the Broadband ReConnect Program; and

WHEREAS: The Town of Nichols has identified a need for the extension of broadband services to unserved and underserved areas; and

WHEREAS: Tioga County supports and encourages the extension of broadband services within the County; and

WHEREAS: The Southern Tier Network (STN) is a nonprofit open access communication organization that enables fast affordable reliable internet access in New York State's Southern Tier Region; and

WHEREAS: The Town of Nichols is in support of an application to the USDA Broadband ReConnect Program by STN; and

WHEREAS: The USDA Broadband ReConnect grant requires a match not less than twenty-five percent (25%) of the total project cost; and

WHEREAS: The ultimate numbers for the build out have not been finalized, but are estimated at \$1.7 million dollars; and

WHEREAS: Tioga County has pledged American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds toward the effort to extend broadband services to unserved and underserved areas of the County; and

WHEREAS: The Town of Nichols and Tioga County have agreed to provide an equal match injection not to exceed \$300,000 each; and

WHEREAS: \$300,000 will be provided using American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding which will be allocated to account A1680 540140 M7674 Contracted Services with a separate Resolution provided by the ARPA Fund Administrator; and

WHEREAS: The USDA Broadband ReConnect grant application will be in the name of STN and submitted for a total of approximately \$1,275,000 in grant funds; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Tioga County Legislature hereby authorizes the use of ARPA Funds to be utilized as matching funds for the purpose of extending broadband to the unserved and underserved areas of the Town of Nichols in an amount not more than the Town of Nichols match and not to exceed \$300,000.

Agriculture Resource Group Quarterly Report to the Legislature

ARG set out an ambitious set of priorities in 2021, and most of them were directly addressed and completed within the calendar year. These include:

- Updating the Agriculture Resource Directory <u>https://www.tiogacountyny.com/media/9336/arg-ag-directory-4-2-21.pdf</u> This resource is a one-stop shop for farmers to connect with agriculture service providers, both agencies and for-profit agricultural businesses.
- Improved ARG presence for the Tioga County Fair. ARG coordinated with CCE Tioga and Tioga County Soil and Water to have a strong presence in the fair. There were multiple demonstrations, story times by local agriculture writers, spinning demonstrations, farm toy displays, and more.
- Solar and Agriculture co-location (Agrivoltaics) research and information. Solar fields are coming to Tioga County. ARG members sought more information about doing small scale agriculture (grazing sheep, keeping bees, etc.) within the confines of a solar field. CCE Tioga hosted a Cornell Ag and Life Science intern, Leigh Miller, who did research on this rapidly evolving field, and created three fact sheets that both farmers and municipal leaders can use to make decisions regarding solar, leasing land to solar developers, and planning agrivoltaics at solar fields. A decision matrix was drafted and disseminated to municipal leaders to help them make informed decisions about permits for solar developments.
- Safety for farmers on large farm equipment and for the Amish using buggies and bicycles on our roads has been a concern of farmers for several years. ARG has been exploring the use of lawn signs to remind residents and visitors to take care when driving our roads—especially those where the line of sight is obstructed.

For our January meeting, members of ARG set out priorities for 2022. These include:

- Having a "Farm Vehicle Awareness" month in the early fall and giving lawn signs to residents to raise awareness of safe driving techniques. ARG will pay for the signs and also submit articles to media and social media to remind folks to drive safely.
- Sundaes at the Farm will return in 2022, assuming it can be done safely. Planning is beginning for a July event.
- ARG will work with the county's agriculture teachers to help them connect with the opportunities and resources in our farming community and agriculture service providers. We envision creating a document that lists contacts, expertise, and resources the teachers can use with their students.
- Work continues on the strategies presented in the KK & P study, especially around aggregation. Possibilities include aggregation for bulk purchases of farming inputs, aggregating products for markets, and the like.
- CCE Tioga and Experience Tioga will work together to increase awareness of the agritourism opportunities in the county. We will help roll out the new Finger Lakes Farm Country tour widgets and help new farmers get listed on the FLFC website. <u>https://fingerlakesfarmcountry.com/</u>



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Legislative Report February 2022

AGRICULTURE:

- AGNPSC Grant Updates:
 - Round 23: Grants complete working close out for both Round 23 grants.
 - Round 24: construction complete of fencing and waterlines, working on solar pump issue for watering system.
 - Round 25 Project Completed.
 - Round 26 Implementation of fall cover crops occurred, obtained soil samples, and waiting to fall 2022 implementation.
 - Round 27- Grant awarded for 3 farms to implement stream corridor plans, including buffer and wetland components. Work plan submitted to state waiting on contract.
- Buffer Planning & Implementation Staff are currently working on buffer planning for spring 2022.
- Partnerships:
 - ARG Attended January ARG meeting discussed focus for 2022.
- AEM Base Round 16 Program.
 - 2 year contract complete work on grant closeout all funds expended (\$270,000).
 - Implementation has been completed on 2 farms that installed grazing systems along with wetland and/or riparian buffer systems. We also assisted with Riparian buffer mowing payments on 2 other farms this work is done to ensure buffers are established.
- AEM Base Round 17 Program:
 - Submitted a work plan for our next 2 years of funding, requesting \$280,000, with breakout as follows: \$180,000 technical assistance funding and \$100,000 for implementation, working on finalizing work plan for implementation now.
 - BMP Verification for Chesapeake Bay Program (CBP) received new verification list of 2022: 14 farms, 1 stream and 1 wetland project.
 - Plan development with farms we have numerous farms working with the District on grazing plans (2), stream corridor plans (3), and Comprehensive Nutrient Management plans (3).
- NRCS Contribution Agreement (CTA): Tioga SWCD has a PE on staff, we received a contract from NRCS to support engineering workload in the watershed. 75% of our staff time is covered for design, construction oversight, and as-builts.
 - Otsego Projects: 5 projects underway (combination of farmstead and stream practices)
 - Cortland Projects: 3 projects designed and implemented, assessing additional workload for 2022.
 - Steuben Projects: 2 projects completed in 2021.
 - Chenango: 1 stream project design completed, implementation planned for 2022.
 - Chemung: 1 Cropland project design completed

CHESAPEAKE BAY TMDL:

Working with NYSDEC on new contracts and agreements to support the Phase III Watershed Implementation Plan (WIP).

DEAN CREEK WATERSHED PROTECTION PROJECT:

Watershed Rehabilitation Planning project with NRCS: continued work on plan. A virtual public meeting was held on January 18th at 7 pm, there was good participation but no questions. Next steps will be to identify the local sponsors (County, T of Spencer and SWCD) preferred alternative based on the alternatives presented at the public meeting.

HAZARD MITIGATION:

- County Contract working with ED&P on purchasing of BATool for tracking of project progress.
- NYRC Regional River Initiative: construction underway for at both projects Gaylord Rd and Fuller Hollow Creek. Fuller Hollow anticipated to be wrapped up next week; Gaylord Road was stopped for winter work and will resume in the spring. Completion date of Gaylord will be 6/1.
- Disaster Declaration 4625 working on projects funding requests.

STORMWATER: Town of Owego Solar project SWPPP to review.

STREAM PROGRAM:

WQIP grants:

- Fox Rd. Culvert Design- design underway, expect completed design this winter.
- <u>Owego Creek</u> Glenmary Drive project developed design and engineering cost estimate, estimate exceeds grant funds, we will continue to look for other grant sources, and in the meantime will wait to see if our HMGP buyout application is successful.
- <u>Municipal and Private landowner assistance</u>- multiple site visits made to assist landowners with stream issues and assistance provided to highway departments on planned projects.

MEETINGS, TRAININGS & MISCELLANEOUS ACTIVITIES:

- <u>Ag Assessments</u>: working on assessments.
- <u>Tree and Shrub</u> order forms complete, posted to website and being mailed.
- <u>Solar BMP Committee</u> participating in county committee, working with consultant to develop recommendations for solar project review and installation including draft Pilot language, BMPs that municipalities should consider requiring, etc.
