Early Voting for the Spencer primary will be Saturday June 17th through Sunday June 25th at the Board of Elections.

The Board of Elections will be joining the Udemy Business online training application to expand the skills and qualifications of election staff.

FINANCIAL

Year-to-Date Budget Report was presented. No discussion.

The 2024 Elections Budget Request with Notes attached was presented and discussed.

Obj 412910 Elections Fees was increased by \$1,000.00 estimated on revenue due to historical actuals.

Obj 510030 Overtime Pay Only was made separate with an estimated OT required for early voting for 3 elections, based on historical actuals.

Increases were added to the following line items due to holding 3 high turnout elections in 2024. Obj 540010 Advertising \$ 500.00, Obj 540490 Election Expense \$19,500.00, and Obj 540550 Rent-Lease \$600.00.

A transfer of \$500.00 was made from Obj 540320 Leased/Services Equipment to Obj 540560 Repairs for vehicle maintenance.

Obj 540143 Election Inspector was left to discuss separately. There was an increase of \$38,318.00 due to the third election, higher voter turnout, additional staffing, and the expected increase in minimum wage. Additionally, Obj 540143 EV Election Inspectors Increased \$17,400.00 for the same reasons.

Additional discussion was held concerning the IRS requirement that the inspectors are to be county employees. Ongoing plans to determine and create the best path continue with all departments involved.

NEW BUSINESS

The request for use of social media, a Facebook page was approved providing we follow all county and ITCS guidelines. The Deputies have agreed to manage the page, with oversight by the Commissioners.

Commissioner Wahls and Deputy Commissioner Johnson are attending the Summer Training Conference in in Niagara Falls August 15-18^{th.}

We have 120 Election Inspectors trained and 62 left to train in the last 2 weeks of August.

Plans and dates finalized for use of county cars from our current building as of GE 2023.

Discussion was held on the Bills on Governor's desk. There is hope that the

"Early Vote by Mail" and the Local Elections to move to even years with State and Federal offices Bills will be challenged if signed into Law. The Mandatory training curriculum for poll workers, train-the-trainer program, involves statewide mandates.

FINANCIAL

Year-to-date budget reports are attached for operating and capital budgets. A payment was made out of the capital budget for penetration testing, reimbursable under the NYS elections cybersecurity remediation grant.

OLD BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS

The 2023 primary election was completed with no issues. Turnout was very low, as expected for such a small primary. Early Voting: 2 voters; Election Day: 58 voters; Absentees: 6 voters. Unofficial results indicate that the margin of victory is within 20 or fewer votes, so a mandatory manual recount will be required following completion of the canvass.

The post-election audit of voting equipment was completed on Friday, June 30th, with no discrepancies discovered.

The canvass of affidavit ballots will take place on the morning of July 5th, and the recanvass of all voting machines will begin following the canvass of affidavits (resulting in our absence from this meeting).

Summer election inspector trainings begin July 17th. We have a total of 10 classes, up to 20 people per class, scheduled through the end of August.

PERSONNEL

Amber Duke began work as our new Democratic Deputy Commissioner on June 19th, and we are grateful to have her on board.

State Board of Elections Warns New York Voters Against Impersonation of County Board of Elections Officials

ALBANY, N.Y. (08/30/2023) – The State Board of Elections has recently become aware that individuals, across multiple counties throughout the state, have been going door-to-door impersonating County Board of Elections staff. These individuals are confronting voters regarding their registration status, and erroneously accusing voters of committing a crime because of how they appear in the state voter database.

"We are extremely alarmed by these actions. These individuals are impersonating government officials in an effort to intimidate voters based on inaccurate and misleading information," said Raymond J. Riley III, Co-Executive Director of the State Board of Elections. "We strongly encourage those engaging in these activities to cease immediately."

County Board of Elections staff members work tirelessly year-round to ensure elections are safe and secure. They engage in extensive record-keeping processes in an ever-changing environment and are an integral part of protecting our democracy from bad actors, including those who are engaging in this current impersonation behavior.

"We want to assure all New Yorkers that any employee of the State or County Board of Elections would conduct themselves in a professional manner and willingly present identification when engaging with voters," said Kristen Zebrowski Stavisky, Co-Executive Director of the State Board of Elections. "When in doubt, please know you can always contact your State or County Board of Elections directly with any questions."

If a voter is approached by someone claiming to be from the State or County Board of Elections, they are encouraged to immediately request identification. If the individual refuses or appears under suspicious circumstances, the State Board recommends collecting as much information as possible, not providing the individual with any personal information, and contacting local law enforcement to report the incident.

Criminal impersonation in the second degree is a class A misdemeanor in New York State. The State Board of Elections remains in close communication with the County Boards and law enforcement to monitor this situation.
